

Duties of the MSBA Delegates and Alternate

MSBA Delegates


SSD is a due-paying member of the Missouri School Boards Association (MSBA). It is the belief of the Board that by organizing and collaborating with other districts statewide the districts are able to continually improve and level of education and professional services produced to children throughout Missouri. The following list of duties has been recommended by the MSBA to achieve optimum participation.

1. Serve as liaisons between MSBA and the Board of Education.
2. Serve as contact persons for communications from the Regional Executive Committee (REC) chair, the MSBA Board of Directors and MSBA staff.
3. Provide MSBA an e-mail account and other contact information and regularly monitor them to receive communications for this purpose.
4. Share information received from the REC chair, MSBA Board of Directors and MSBA staff with the Board according to the Board's Business Meeting Agenda. The report will include information about state and national issues impacting public education, opportunities and concerns related to public schools, and other specific information important to boards of education and the school districts they represent.
5. Serve as members of the Regional executive committee (REC)
6. Actively participate in the development of MSBA advocacy positions.
7. Serve as advocates for public education by maintaining a working relationship with elected officials who represent the District at the local, state and federal levels.
8. Attend and participate in MSBA Delegate Assemblies.
9. Attend and participate in RAC meetings.

Duties of the MSBA Alternate

The MSBA alternate delegate will assume the role of the delegate if the delegate is unable to serve. A member of the Board may also be a parent or family member of an individual with a disability, or may her/himself have a disability. Because this may not always permit participation in the full list of responsibilities above, Board members are encouraged to collaborate to develop a flexible participation format for SSD's representatives.
