SCOPE AND SEQUENCE

The following resources will provide students with a continuum of essential social emotional skills including effective communication skills, understanding and managing emotions and behavior, establishing and maintaining positive relationships, and making safe and responsible decisions across multiple settings. Each teaching resource will align with one or more of the competencies and sub-competencies listed below. This alignment will support lesson planning that will directly address documented student learning needs.

All of the teaching resources listed below have undergone extensive research and analysis and are considered evidence-based. Most of the resources are endorsed by The Collaborative for Academic, Social, and Emotional Learning (CASEL) and listed in the <u>CASEL Guide</u>. Administrators and teams are encouraged to use the <u>Intervention Selection Tool</u> when deciding what is best for students' instruction. CASEL also provides <u>guidelines for selecting evidence-based SEL programs</u> for districts and school-based teams.

These resources were selected to be supported by the SEB EPS Team and building level administrators. Only some training is deployed county-wide and some publishers/organizations execute their own training. Please contact your SEB EPS to inquire about training and/or support.

If there is a program not on the list that better meets the needs of the student/area/building, then training options would need to be sought through the publisher and supported by the building level administrator.

Instructors receive scripted lesson plans, age-appropriate worksheets in English or Spanish, checklists, bookmarks, cards and posters for teaching and reinforcing the skills inside and outside the classroom.
